Doug Kelbaugh, Ann Street, stated more ADUs are the answer to affordable housing.

A resident on Kensington Drive stated the City is failing at affordable housing.

Ed Vielmetti, Ward Four, spoke about affordable housing. Devon O'Toole, UM student, spoke in support and stated he worked on

the student project that helped draft the ordinance.
